Missouri Foundation for Health Grant Award

The Missouri Foundation for Health (MFH) has awarded Spectrum Health Care a four-year, \$825,710.00 grant. The funding is part of the MFH focus on reimagining approaches to improve access to care.

This grant will make it possible for Spectrum Health Care to strengthen clinic operations locally in Columbia. In years 2-4 expand to reach all 31 rural Missouri counties in our region; and connect geographically isolated patients to health care providers and resources in their local communities. In addition, this grant will allow Spectrum to develop a Rural Providers Network committed to collaborating with us in providing our clients and patients a safe, affirming and culturally competent care experience.



This grant will help us increase access to primary care, including dental services, substance abuse treatment and mental health care. Over the four years, the project will build a shared knowledge base collaboratively with other MFH grantees and stakeholders. Phoenix Health Programs is a key collaborative and referral partner.

Missouri Foundation for Health is a resource for the region, working with communities and nonprofits to generate and accelerate positive changes in health. As a catalyst for change, MFH improves the health of Missourians through partnership, experience, knowledge, and funding.

Prevention Education for HIV/STD/Hepatitis C

Prevention Education is a core program at Spectrum Health Care. Among other things, prevention education keeps our Missouri communities accurately informed on personal health and wellness, HIV/STD and Hepatitis C. Our staff and interns provide: public school education; “Bag It Up” campaign; evening walk-in testing clinics; condom drop off to local businesses; condom bar handouts; outreach education and testing events; at Missouri colleges and universities; and participate in community health fairs and events.

The Prevention Education program is aiming to reach a greater majority of Missourians, reaching our publics schools, universities and colleges in the region. We believe that prevention education is the key to overall better health and wellness.

Our Investment in Your Community

The following graphic depicts the percentage break down for 3,446 unduplicated clients/patients served by Spectrum Health Care by program entry for the first nine months of 2017 (outer ring); additionally, the graph shows the total cost of the program operation relative to the numbers served (inner ring). We anticipate a dramatic increase in the number of clients/patients engaged in services through the Clinic. Our anticipated 2018 total number of persons served is to top 5000 individuals across the entire North Central Region.
